It's now late fall or early winter (depending on where you moved here from), the time when KSB's

annual membership renewal letter arrives in your mailbox. It lists the accomplishments of the past year, but not what is already on the docket for 2015. To help you decide to support KSB and become an active member, here is a preview of activities for you to choose from – any or all.

- KSB's 43rd Annual Awards for Excellence honoring deserving awardees will be held at Los Abrigados January 24, 2015. Come help us celebrate those who give so much to our community
- In March you can participate in KSB's Annual Native Plant Workshop – always a worthwhile learning experience about water-wise landscaping and water conservation
- Our popular monthly Preserving the Wonder TM Speaker Series continues.
- Join KSB's Litter Lifters who keep over 65 miles of Sedona-area roads litter-free.
- We will work with the City of Sedona to assure the continuance of the Dark-Sky

designation and to implement the City's matching-grant program for replacement of non-conforming grand-fathered lights; we will monitor, measure, educate and report on our progress.

- The KSB Dark Sky Committee will help other entities seeking a Dark-Sky designation. The first two will be the Village of Oak Creek via the Big Park Regional Coordinating Council, and Red Rock State Park.
- KSB will take the lead to reinvigorate the Noise Abatement task force to address aircraft noise in our community.
- KSB is an active party in the budding Sustainability Alliance among the area's major environmental non-profits. The objectives of the Alliance are to establish a collaborative framework for communications, coordination, mutual support and joint programs to move our community forward to the next step in improving Sedona area's sustainability and minimizing our footprint on this unique and fragile environment.

KSB will roll out its Endowment Fund Campaign to assure the future financial stability of KSB to continue its mission of environmental stewardship.

Sedona is named the 6th International Dark-Sky Community in the US and 8th in the World

At the September 23 City Council meeting, City of Sedona Manager Tim Ernster presented a beautiful etchedglass plaque from the International Dark-Sky Association (IDA) to the City of Sedona and to Keep Sedona Beautiful, recognizing the City as the world's eighth International Dark-Sky Community.

The Dark-Sky Community designation is given by the IDA for "...exceptional

dedication to the preservation of the night sky through the implementation and enforcement of quality lighting codes, dark sky education, and citizen support of dark skies...".

Sedona has a decades-long history of such dedication. Its residents have been concerned with the preservation of Sedona's beautiful dark night sky since the 1990s. Foremost among organizations trying to dim the proliferating light pollution was Keep Sedona Beautiful, Inc. (KSB). Its Dark-Sky Committee set out in 1999 to help write an Outdoor Lighting Ordinance for the City of Sedona and also one for Yavapai County, setting lighting standards that curb light pollution.

The designation of Sedona as an International Dark-Sky Community is the result of a renewed collaboration effort etween the City and KSB. Joanne Kendrick, Chair of KSB's Dark-Sky Committee states: "We at KSB are so thrilled that Sedona is the 8th International Dark-Sky Community in the World and the 6th in the United States. I personally have been fascinated with the stars in the sky since I was a little girl, and the magnificent dark

sky of Sedona was one of my reasons for moving here. I am grateful for having been given the chance to help preserve our starstudded night sky by pursuing the Dark-Sky Community designation for Sedona from the IDA. I thank Mayor Adams for having posed the challenge, Tom O'Halleran, then President of KSB, for his unflagging support throughout the application process, City staff for supplying the data on the City's light-pollution control measures, and all the many businesses and individuals who wrote KSB in support of dark-sky protection. KSB will carry on reducing light pollution so that Sedona can continue to live up to the expectations of an International Dark-Sky Community."

The IDA designations are not permanent but require the communities to monitor and report annually the city's night-sky light level; to prevent increases in light pollution as the city grows; to install adaptive controls for city lights; to continually educate the public about the benefits of a dark night sky. KSB is committed to give the City its full support for retaining the designation for many years to come.



KSB RECEIVES "AWARD OF MERIT" FROM ARIZONA FORWARD

On September 20, 2014, Keep Sedona Beautiful (KSB) was honored at the 34th Annual Environmental Excellence Awards Program put on by Arizona Forward (AZ Forward). This competition is the largest, most prominent awards competition of its kind,

recognizing distinguished environmental contributions to the Valley and State. The AZ Forward program embraces projects throughout the Grand Canyon State, with a 45-year legacy of bridging economic growth and environmental quality.

In accordance with specific guidelines in the "Environmental

Education/Communication" category, KSB submitted an application and a display board featuring its 42-year history of litter lifting, volunteer hours, the Speaker Series, Native Plant Workshop, Annual Awards of Excellence, work on promotion of the National Scenic Area (NSA) designation for our area, advice on improvement to the Draft Coconino National Forest Management Plan, and most recently, leading the effort with the City of Sedona to receive the Dark-Sky Designation from the International Dark-Sky Association.

AZ Forward was started in 1969. The association brings business and civic leaders together to improve environmental quality and economic vitality of cities and towns throughout Arizona. The members believe environmental quality is directly related to the conservation of natural resources, consideration of indigenous or historic qualities, emerging technologies, and regard for human life.

KEEP SEDONA BEAUTIFUL ADOPTS NEW LOGO

eep Sedona Beautiful, Inc., (KSB) has a new logo. KSB, as it is commonly referred to, was incorporated in 1972, long before there was a City of Sedona. A group of citizens concerned about mounting roadside trash and proliferation of billboards, founded the organization and appropriately named it Keep Sedona Beautiful. KSB's first logo conveyed the organization's name – actually, a request or call to action -- and a reason for the request: it's good business. The image of the expansive tree with an equally expansive root system symbolizes a concern for Nature. KSB's first volunteer group – the famous Litter Lifters -cleared the roadside litter. Today, more than 40 years later, the KSB Litter Lifters keep 65 miles of the now extensive network of Greater Sedona roads litter-free. Billboards and other commercial signage were getting out of hand in 1972. To put a damper on their proliferation, KSB promoted limitations on their size and location and led the effort to establish the outdoor-sign ordinances now in place in Yavapai County and the City of Sedona.

The area's rapid population growth and high rate of conversion of agricultural and range land into subdivisions made clear that to keep Sedona beautiful, to preserve the wonder of the red-rock landscape, land preservation has to be a priority. In the late '80s and '90s KSB and others collaborated with the Coconino National Forest Service on an amendment to the Forest Service's Management Plan to put 160,000 acres of National Forest land in the Greater Sedona area off-limits to land trade for private development. The ensuing amendment to the Plan became reality in 1998 as Amendment 12 and still stands today. It will be incorporated into the new 2015 Management Plan.

Today, KSB focuses on land preservation, on protection of our natural resources, especially water; on the management of our area's National Forest lands; on preserving scenic view sheds and access to our public lands, and on protecting the dark skies of the Greater Sedona area. KSB has long tackled light pollution by helping to write the City's and County's Outdoor Lighting Ordinances. Last fall and this spring KSB worked anew with the City of Sedona to qualify for the coveted Dark-Sky designation, as a result of which Sedona became this year the 8th International Dark-Sky Community in the world. KSB also offers educational programs such as the monthly Preserving the WonderTM Speaker Series, the Annual Native Plant Workshop,

the Annual Awards in Excellence. KSB's mission statement "Keep Sedona Beautiful, Inc., acting through the stewardship of its members and volunteers, committed to protect and sustain the unique scenic beauty and natural environment of the Greater Sedona Area. " is expressed in the new logo design that evolved from earlier designs. In 2007, the first logo's image of the tree was replaced with the iconic image for the greater Sedona area, Cathedral Rock; the tagline was changed to Preserving the Wonder Since 1972, and the round shape was abandoned in favor of a rectangle. In 2012, the tagline of this logo was changed to Environmental Stewards Since 1972 to reflect KSB's concern for the natural environment. But the Board of directors still was not satisfied – for the text to be legible, the rectangular logo had to be fairly large, and it resembled the recently issued Arizona Centennial stamp. The new round logo solved these problems. It also added the organization's acronym and more symbolism: the strong white circle suggests protection forever of the Red Rocks and star-studded sky enclosed by it (a circle has no beginning or end). The protectors, of course, are KSB's volunteers the environmental stewards. Won't you join us?


