







1a. Estimated % of adults who think climate change is happening, 2016, by county.

1c. Estimated % of adults who think global warming is harming people in the US, 2016, by county.




Most people think that climate change will harm Americans, but they don't think it will happen to them.

To tear down the fence here is to remove the obstacles set up AROUND doubt, not wanting to know, not taking responsibility.




Most people think that climate change will harm Americans, but they don't think it will happen to them.

1. Conclusion: The CC fences to tear down

- Sought cooperation with climate and environmental groups in Flag, Sedona, Cottonwood starting in Prescott--lots more to do
- Tabled/petitioned at dozens of events across the region. totals to date: 4500 sigs in Flag, 1450 in Sedona, 400 in Cottonwood.
 Contacted some 10000
- Worked on the 127 Yes. Distributed some 10000 flyers.
- Co-hosted educational events, talks, +200; this Jan, 30 events from talks, to knocks, to trainings.
- Supported strong CAP
- Worked with faith groups, or in schools spreading cc awareness
- Local 501 c3, hired 2.

- 5. Can propel sweeping, deep changes
